Bachelor's degree in a related field and at least one year of experience as an Early Childcare Educator required. Applicants must also meet ODJFS background check requirements. Certifications and trainings in First Aid, CPR, Communicable Disease, and Child Abuse and Neglect preferred. A working knowledge of ODJFS Child Care licensing, NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) and SUTQ (Step Up to Quality) also preferred. Rate of pay is \$14.00 per hour based on education and experience.
